# **Course Description**

To have fun making music together as an ensemble. Students will continue to strengthen their playing technique on stringed instruments. Repertoire represents a variety of styles, cultures and time periods at the high school level. Students will analyze and critique, collaborate with their peers and problem-solve to improve personal and ensemble performance. Juniors and seniors have the option to receive Honors weighting calculated in their GPA by completing additional projects. All rehearsals and concerts are mandatory. Symphony Orchestra students may be asked to perform in the community and surrounding areas, in addition to school concerts.
